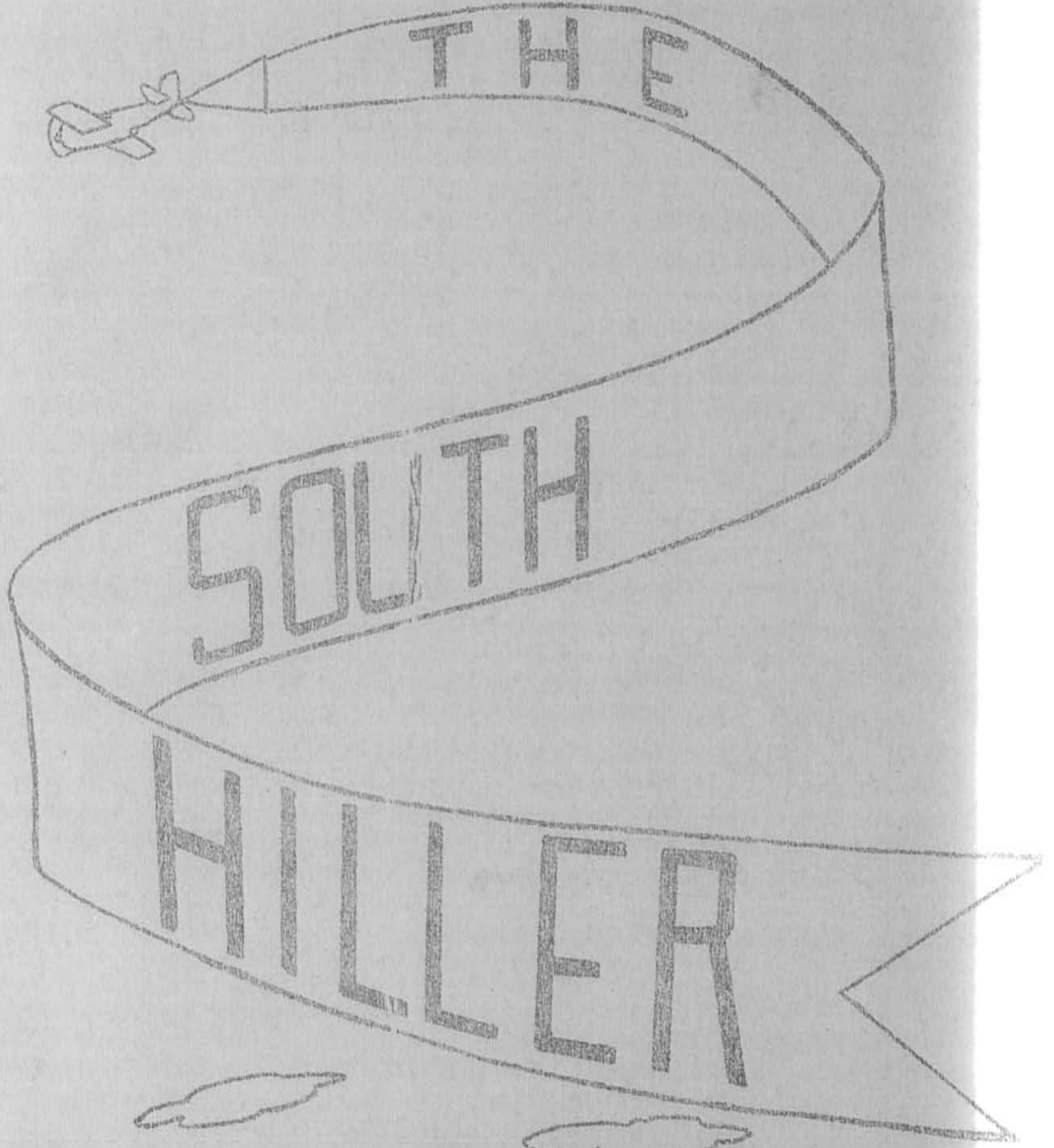

This feeling is natural to all of us. We know that life is a changing and challenging process, and we must meet changes and adjust as graciously and well as possible.


I know the teachers follow your progress as you continue your education, and we are always pleased when honors are given to former "South Hillers".

But sometimes we weren't just sugar and spice.

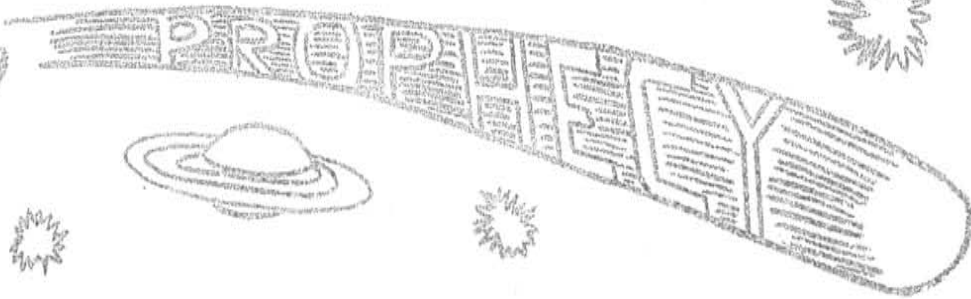
Miss Gould was our third grade teacher, too

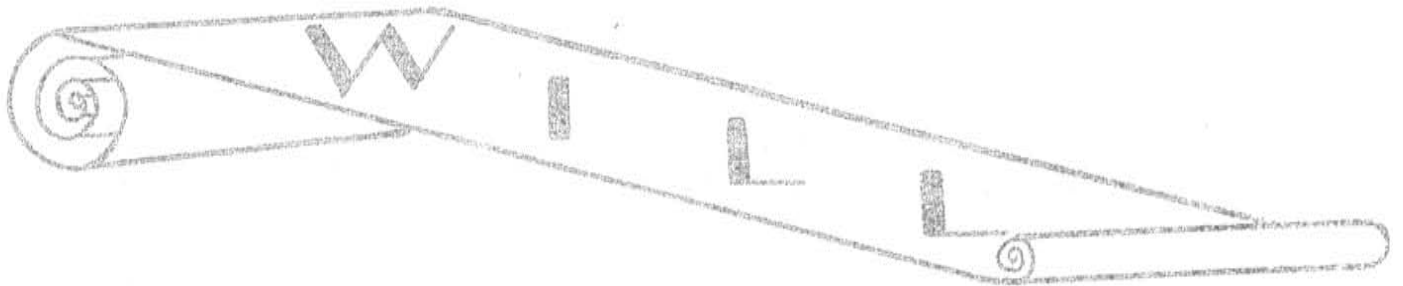
